September 19–25: Isaiah 40–49, "Comfort Ye My People"

Blessings For Keeping Covenants

The choice for Israel at the time of Isaiah is much the same as it is for us, today – whether or not choose keep our covenants and follow Christ, or to choose the temporary pleasures of pursuing worldliness

Isaiah gives many examples and descriptions of how choosing to follow Christ will bring His blessings

For the following passages we are about to read, ask yourself: What blessings are promised to those who obey their covenants and follow Christ?

Isa 40:11-18

11 He shall feed his flock like a shepherd: he shall gather the lambs with his arm, and carry them in his bosom, and shall gently lead those that are with young.

Isa 49:9-10

9 That thou mayest say to the prisoners, Go forth; to them that are in darkness, Shew yourselves. They shall feed in the ways, and their pastures shall be in all high places. 10 They shall not hunger nor thirst; neither shall the heat nor sun smite them: for he that hath mercy on them shall lead them, even by the springs of water shall he guide them.

What blessings are promised to those who obey their covenants and follow Christ?

He will shepherd those who follow Him along the right corse. (he that hath mercy on them shall lead them, even by the springs of water shall he guide them)

- 29 He giveth power to the faint; and to them that have no might he increaseth strength.
- 30 Even the youths shall faint and be weary, and the young men shall utterly fall:
- 31 But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.

A Metaphor of Israel

He uses a metaphor of a foolish young woman to represent Israel and their desire for worldly things

Isa 47:1,8-9

- 1 Come down, and sit in the dust, O virgin daughter of Babylon, <u>sit on the ground:</u> there is no throne, O daughter of the Chaldeans: for thou shalt no more be called tender and delicate.
- 5 Sit thou silent, and get thee into darkness, O daughter of the Chaldeans: for <u>thou shalt no more be called, The lady of kingdoms.</u>
- 6 ¶ I was wroth with my people, I have polluted mine inheritance, and given them into thine hand: thou didst shew them no mercy; upon the ancient hast thou very heavily laid thy yoke.
- 7 ¶ And thou saidst, I shall be a lady for ever: so that thou didst not lay these things to thy heart, neither didst remember the latter end of it.
- 8 Therefore hear now this, thou that art given to pleasures, that dwellest carelessly, that sayest in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me; I shall not sit as a widow, neither shall I know the loss of children:
- 9 But these two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood: they shall come upon thee in their perfection for the multitude of thy sorceries, and for the great abundance of thine enchantments.

What had Israel done that caused them to no longer be considered part of the Lord's kingdom and to sit on the ground instead of a throne?

They did not remember or live their covenants (thou didst not lay these things to thy heart, neither didst remember the latter end of it)

The considered themselves to be move important than anything else that sayest in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me)

And because of this they feel justified in doing whatever they want (thou that art given to pleasures, that dwellest carelessly)

What had Israel lost because they had broken the covenant?

What is most important – the blessings of the covenant (two things shall come to thee in a moment in one day, the loss of children, and widowhood)

Isa 47:10-11

- 10 ¶ For thou hast trusted in thy wickedness: thou hast said, None seeth me. <u>Thy</u> wisdom and thy knowledge, it hath perverted thee; and thou hast said in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me.
- 11 ¶ Therefore shall evil come upon thee; thou shalt not know from whence it riseth: and mischief shall fall upon thee; thou shalt not be able to put it off: and desolation shall come upon thee suddenly, which thou shalt not know.

Again, what will happen if Israel does not remember and live their covenants?

The do not recognize true wisdom and their knowledge is perverted (Thy wisdom and thy knowledge, it hath perverted thee)

Again, they considered themselves to be move important than anything else (thou hast said in thine heart, I am, and none else beside me)

Because of this they do not listen to the prophets and not prepared to avoid destination

(evil come upon thee; thou shalt not know from whence it riseth)

Isa 47:12-15

- 12 Stand now with thine enchantments, and with the multitude of thy sorceries, wherein thou hast laboured from thy youth; if so be thou shalt be able to profit, if so be thou mayest prevail.
- 13 Thou art wearied in the multitude of thy counsels. Let now the astrologers, the stargazers, the monthly prognosticators, stand up, and save thee from these things that shall come upon thee.
- 14 Behold, they shall be as stubble; the fire shall burn them; they shall not deliver themselves from the power of the flame: there shall not be a coal to warm at, nor fire to sit before it.
- 15 Thus shall they be unto thee with whom thou hast laboured, even thy merchants, from thy youth: they shall wander every one to his quarter; none shall save thee.

Again, what will happen if Israel does not seek wisdom and knowledge from the correct source?

(Let now the astrologers, the stargazers, the monthly prognosticators, stand up, and save thee from these things that shall come upon thee) (they shall be as stubble; the fire shall burn them; they shall not deliver themselves from the power of the flame)

Again, they are weary of the Lords counsels, so left with the consciences of the choices they make

The Lord makes it clear what blessings they can expect if they follow Him

- 14 All ye, assemble yourselves, and hear; which among them hath declared these things? The LORD hath loved him: he will do his pleasure on Babylon, and his arm shall be on the Chaldeans.
- 15 I, even I, have spoken; yea, I have called him: I have brought him, and he shall make his way prosperous.
- 16 ¶ Come ye near unto me, hear ye this; I have not spoken in secret from the beginning; from the time that it was, there am I: and now the Lord GOD, and his Spirit, hath sent me.
- 17 Thus saith the LORD, thy Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; <u>I am the LORD thy God which teacheth thee to profit, which leadeth thee by the way that thou shouldest go.</u>
- 18 O that thou hadst hearkened to my commandments! then had thy peace been as a river, and thy righteousness as the waves of the sea:

The Northern Kingdom and the Southern Kingdom

The Israelites of Isaiah's time were left to choose between the world or Christ.

We studied a few weeks ago how the Northern

kingdom was captured by the Assyrians. At the time the Assyrians also came against Jerusalem. Lets read why Jerusalem was spared.

Isa 36:1-2,13-20

1 Now it came to pass in the fourteenth year of king Hezekiah, that Sennacherib king of Assyria came up against all the defenced cities of Judah, and took them.
2 And the king of Assyria sent Rabshakeh from Lachish to Jerusalem unto king Hezekiah with a great army. And he stood by the conduit of the upper pool in the highway of the fuller's field.

- 13 Then Rabshakeh stood, and cried with a loud voice in the Jews' language, and said, Hear ye the words of the great king, the king of Assyria.
- 14 Thus saith the king, Let not Hezekiah deceive you: for he shall not be able to deliver you.
- 15 Neither let Hezekiah make you trust in the LORD, saying, The LORD will surely deliver us: this city shall not be delivered into the hand of the king of Assyria.
- 16 Hearken not to Hezekiah: for thus saith the king of Assyria, Make an agreement with me by a present, and come out to me: and eat ye every one of his vine, and every one of his fig tree, and drink ye every one the waters of his own cistern;

 17 Until Loome and take you away to a land like your own land, a land of corn and
- 17 Until I come and take you away to a land like your own land, a land of corn and wine, a land of bread and vineyards.
- 18 Beware lest Hezekiah persuade you, saying, The LORD will deliver us. Hath any of the gods of the nations delivered his land out of the hand of the king of Assyria? 19 Where are the gods of Hamath and Arphad? where are the gods of Sepharvaim? and have they delivered Samaria out of my hand?
- 20 Who are they among all the gods of these lands, that have delivered their land out of my hand, that the LORD should deliver Jerusalem out of my hand?

What was the Assyrian messenger advising the people of Jerusalem?

Don't trust in a god because it has not worked for your neighbors

The deal that the Assyrians made was for Judea to give them a tribute. Soon they would moved

to other land, but they would not be brutally destroyed.

Let's read how king Hezekiah responded to the Assyrians

Isa 36:5-7

- 5 I say, sayest thou, (but they are but vain words) I have counsel and strength for war: now on whom dost thou trust, that thou rebellest against me?
- 6 Lo, thou trustest in the staff of this broken reed, on Egypt; whereon if a man lean, it will go into his hand, and pierce it: so is Pharaoh king of Egypt to all that trust in him
- 7 But if thou say to me, <u>We trust in the LORD our God</u>: is it not he, whose high places and whose altars Hezekiah hath taken away, and said to Judah and to Jerusalem, Ye shall worship before this altar?

Despite their threats how does king Hezekiah respond to the Assyrians?

You put your trust in the power of man (thou trustest in the staff of this broken reed, on Egypt; whereon if a man

lean, it will go into his hand, and pierce it)

Judah has been taught to worship Jehovah and we will put our trust in Him (We trust in the LORD our God)

Hezekiah calls on Isaiah for council from the Lord

Isa 37:5-7

5 So the servants of king Hezekiah came to Isaiah.

6 ¶ And Isaiah said unto them, Thus shall ye say unto your master, Thus saith the LORD, Be not afraid of the words that thou hast heard, wherewith the servants of the king of Assyria have blasphemed me.

7 Behold, I will send a blast upon him, and he shall hear a rumour, and return to his own land; and I will cause him to fall by the sword in his own land.

And because Hezekiah believed in the servant of the Lord, his people were miraculously spared.

Isa 37:36-38

36 Then the angel of the LORD went forth, and smote in the camp of the Assyrians a hundred and fourscore and five thousand: and when they arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses.

37 ¶ So Sennacherib king of Assyria departed, and went and returned, and dwelt at Nineveh

38 And it came to pass, as he was worshipping in the house of Nisroch his god, that Adrammelech and Sharezer his sons smote him with the sword; and they escaped into the land of Armenia: and Esar-haddon his son reigned in his stead.

How was Isaiah's prophecy fulfilled

JST Isa 37:36

Then the angel of the LORD went forth and smote in the camp of the Assyrians a hundred and fourscore and five thousand; and when they who were left arose early in the morning, behold, they were all dead corpses

This was the beginning of the end for Assyrians

The Northern Kingdom relied on the world and was destroyed. Judea relied on the Lord and was spared.
