

"Lehi, who led the second colony which came to this great land, was told that he was leading that colony to a land of promise and that none should come here save those who would come here under the influence of heaven. This land would be consecrated unto those whom the Lord would guide here." (CR, April 1952)

"This America is no ordinary country. It is a choice land, 'choice above all other lands' (2Ne 2:20). It has a tragic and bloody past, but a glorious and peaceful future if its inhabitants really learn to serve their God. It was consecrated as a land of promise to the people of the Americas, to whom God gave these great promises:

'It will be a land of liberty to its people' (2Ne 1:7).

'They shall never be brought down into captivity' (2Ne 1:7).

'And there shall be none to molest them' (2Ne 1:9).

'It is a land of promise' (1Ne 2:20).

'It shall be free from all nations under heaven.'

'There shall be no enemies come into this land.'

'It shall be free from bondage' (Ether 2:12).

'There shall be no kings upon the land' (2Ne 10:11).

'I will fortify this land against all other nations' (2Ne 10:11).

'He that fighteth against Zion shall perish' (2Ne 10:13).

"There are Church members who are steeped in lethargy. They neither drink nor commit the sexual sins. They do not gamble nor rob nor kill. They are good citizens and splendid neighbors, but spiritually speaking they seem to be in a long, deep sleep. They are doing nothing seriously wrong except in their failures to do the right things to earn their exaltation. To such people as this, the words of Lehi might well apply: 'O that ye would awake; awake from a deep sleep, yea, even from the sleep of hell' (2 Nephi 1:13)." (Church News, 30 June 2001)

"Who among us hasn't felt the chains of bad habits." These habits may have impeded our progress, may have made us forget who we are, may have destroyed our self-image, may have put our family life in jeopardy, and may have hindered our ability to serve our fellowmen and our God. So many of us tend to say. 'This is the way I am. I can't change'. Lehi warned his sons to "shake off the chains" because he knew that chains restrict our mobility, growth, and happiness.... [These chains] can only be broken by people who are willing to change.... Those who are committed to improvement break chains by having the courage to try." (CR, Oct. 1985)

"Our needed conversions are often achieved more readily by suffering and adversity than by comfort and tranquillity.... Father Lehi promised his son Jacob that God would 'consecrate [his] afflictions for [his] gain.' The Prophet Joseph was promised that 'thine adversity and thine afflictions shall be but a small moment; and then, if thou endure it well, God shall exalt thee on high.'

"Most of us experience some measure of what the scriptures call 'the furnace of affliction.' Some are submerged in service to a disadvantaged family member. Others suffer the death of a loved one or the loss or postponement of a righteous goal like marriage or childbearing.... Through the justice and mercy of a loving Father in Heaven, the refinement and sanctification possible through such experiences can help us achieve what God desires us to become." (CR, Oct. 2000)

"Modern doctrine [states] that there is no personal responsibility for wrongdoing.... If a man commits a crime—lies, steals, commits adultery, or even murders —he has no personal responsibility for his act.... I compared that evil doctrine with the teachings Lehi gave to his sons as he was about to go down into his grave. I remember how he taught his sons that men were placed upon the earth between good and evil, that... they are held responsible for their decisions and actions. And as the Lord liveth, that doctrine is true....

"This doctrine that man is not morally responsible for his own acts, which is gaining wide acceptance in the world today, is the doctrine of the evil one." (CR, April 1949)

If there were no opposition, no competing choices - in other words, if all alternatives were compounded into one - of what value would the gift of agency be? Divine aid can be ours every hour of every day, no matter where we are in the path of obedience. But I know that beyond desiring His help, we must exert ourselves, repent, and choose God for Him to be able to act in our lives consistent with justice and moral agency.
