

Zech 6:15

D&C 45:47-53

- 47 Then shall the arm of the Lord fall upon the nations.
- 48 And then shall the Lord set his foot upon this mount, and it shall cleave in twain, and the earth shall tremble, and reel to and fro, and the heavens also shall shake.
- 49 And the Lord shall utter his voice, and all the ends of the earth shall hear it; and the nations of the earth shall mourn, and they that have laughed shall see their folly.
- 50 And calamity shall cover the mocker, and the scorner shall be consumed; and they that have watched for iniquity shall be hewn down and cast into the fire.
- 51 And then shall the Jews look upon me and say: What are these wounds in thine hands and in thy feet?
- 52 Then shall they know that I am the Lord; for I will say unto them: These wounds are the wounds with which I was wounded in the house of my friends. I am he who was lifted up. I am Jesus that was crucified. I am the Son of God.

"By means of their prophecies and the power of God attending them, the nations who are gathered together against Jerusalem will be kept at bay, these Prophets will hold them in check by their faith and power. By and by these nations overcome the two witnesses and, having finished their mission, they are slain, and their bodies will lie three days and a half in the streets of the city. Then a great earthquake will take place, and these two witnesses will be caught up to heaven." (JD, 16:326)

Zech 14:2

Bruce R. McConkie

"All the desolation and waste which attended the former destruction of Jerusalem is but prelude to the coming siege.... In the coming reenactment of this "abomination of desolation," the whole world will be at war, Jerusalem will be the center of the conflict.... In the midst of the siege the Son of Man shall come, setting his foot upon the mount of Olives and fighting the battle of his saints." (Doctrinal New Testament Commentary, 1: 659)

Zech 4:4-5

Orson Pratt

"While they are in the very act of destroying Jerusalem, behold the heavens are rent, and the Son of God with all the heavenly hosts appears, and he descends and rests upon the summit of the Mount of Olives, which is before Jerusalem on the east. And so great will be the power of God that will then be made manifest, that the mountain will divide asunder, half going towards the south, and half towards the north, producing a great valley going east and west, from the walls of Jerusalem eastward.

"What next? The Jews that are not taken captive by these nations, will flee to the valleys of the mountains.... The personage they have been looking for some eighteen hundred years is the true Messiah, and now, say they-'He has come to deliver us." (JD, 18:65)

"Then they will accept Him as their Redeemer, which they have never been willing to do. Then is the time as spoken of in this passage from Zechariah when... they will mourn and they will weep because they were not willing to accept the Son of God but accepted the teachings of their fathers and rejected their Redeemer and Messiah. Then they will fall down at His feet and worship Him. After these days will come their redemption and the building of Jerusalem." (Signs of the Times, pg. 171–72)

Zech 13:1

Orson Pratt

"A stream will break out from under the threshold of the Temple, says the Prophet, and it will run eastward, and will probably pass directly through the deep valley made by the parting of the Mount of Olives....

"This is the fountain that Zechariah says is open to the inhabitants of Jerusalem and to the house of David for sin and uncleanness.... Then the Jews will receive the Gospel and they will be cleansed from all their sins by being baptized in water for their remission." (JD, 18:66)

Zech 8:3,23 Zech 14:9,11

John Taylor

"The Lord will be king over all the earth, and all mankind literally under his sovereignty, and every nation under the heavens will have to acknowledge his authority, and bow to his scepter. He will enforce his laws, and command that obedience from the nations of the world which is legitimately his right. Satan will not then be permitted to control its inhabitants, for the Lord God will be king over all the earth." (Teachings of Presidents of the Church: John Taylor, pg. 225)
