Lesson5: Moses 7, "The Lord Called His People Zion"

Enoch Preaches the Gospel

Moses 7:1,9-12

1 And it came to pass that Enoch continued his speech, saying: Behold, our father Adam taught these things, and many have believed and become the sons of God, and many have believed not, and have perished in their sins, and are looking forth with fear, in torment, for the fiery indignation of the wrath of God to be poured out upon them.

9 And it came to pass that the Lord said unto me: Look; and I looked, and I beheld the land of Sharon, and the land of Enoch, and the land of Omner, and the land of Heni, and the land of Shem, and the land of Haner, and the land of Hanannihah, and all the inhabitants thereof;

10 And the Lord said unto me: Go to this people, and say unto them—Repent, lest I come out and smite them with a curse, and they die.

11 And he gave unto me a commandment that I should baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, which is full of grace and truth, and of the Holy Ghost, which beareth record of the Father and the Son.

12 And it came to pass that Enoch continued to call upon all the people, save it were the people of Canaan, to repent;

Last week we read about how Enoch taught the gospel of Christ with exactness and boldness. For example:

Moses 6:57-60

57 <u>Wherefore teach it unto your children</u>, that all men, everywhere, must repent, or they can in nowise inherit the kingdom of God, for no unclean thing can dwell there, or dwell in his presence; for, in the language of Adam, Man of Holiness is his name, and the name of his Only Begotten is the Son of Man, even Jesus Christ, a righteous Judge, who shall come in the meridian of time.

58 Therefore I give unto you a commandment, to teach these things freely unto your children, saying:

59 That by reason of transgression cometh the fall, which fall bringeth death, and inasmuch as ye were born into the world by water, and blood, and the spirit, which I have made, and so became of dust a living soul, even so ye must be born again into the kingdom of heaven, of water, and of the Spirit, and be cleansed by blood, even the blood of mine Only Begotten; that ye might be sanctified from all sin, and enjoy the words of eternal life in this world, and eternal life in the world to come, even immortal glory; 60 For by the water ye keep the commandment; by the Spirit ye are justified, and by the blood ye are sanctified;

Why did Enoch refrain from teaching the gospel to the Canaanites?

Moses 7:7-8,15,22

7 And the Lord said unto me: Prophesy; and I prophesied, saying: Behold the people of Canaan, which are numerous, shall go forth in battle array against the people of Shum, and shall slay them that they shall utterly be destroyed; and the people of Canaan shall divide themselves in the land, and the land shall be barren and unfruitful, and none other people shall dwell there but the people of Canaan;

8 For behold, the Lord shall curse the land with much heat, and the barrenness thereof shall go forth forever; and there was a blackness came upon all the children of Canaan, that they were despised among all people.

15 And the giants of the land, also, stood afar off; and there went forth a curse upon all people that fought against God;

22 And Enoch also beheld the residue of the people which were the sons of Adam; and they were a mixture of all the seed of Adam save it was the seed of Cain, for the seed of Cain were black, and had not place among them.

We have several examples of people in Old Testament times who are cursed by the Lord:

It seems that the people of Canaan were cursed for destroying the people of Shum

Cain was cursed for murdering Abel (Gen. 4:11-12)

Lamech was cursed for murdering for the oath's sake (Moses 5:52) And in verse 15 it states that all the people that fought against God were cursed

Enoch and Zion

Moses 7:13,16-21

13 And so great was the faith of Enoch that he led the people of God, and their enemies came to battle against them; and he spake the word of the Lord, and the earth trembled, and the mountains fled, even according to his command; and the rivers of water were turned out of their course; and the roar of the lions was heard out of the wilderness; and all nations feared greatly, so powerful was the word of Enoch, and so great was the power of the language which God had given him.

16 And from that time forth there were wars and bloodshed among them; but the Lord came and dwelt with his people, and they dwelt in righteousness.

17 The fear of the Lord was upon all nations, so great was the glory of the Lord, which was upon his people. And the Lord blessed the land, and they were blessed upon the mountains, and upon the high places, and did flourish.

18 And the Lord called his people ZION, <u>because they were of one heart and one</u> mind, and dwelt in righteousness; and there was no poor among them.

19 And Enoch continued his preaching in righteousness unto the people of God. And it came to pass in his days, that he built a city that was called the City of Holiness, even ZION.

20 And it came to pass that Enoch talked with the Lord; and he said unto the Lord: Surely Zion shall dwell in safety forever. But the Lord said unto Enoch: Zion have I blessed, but the residue of the people have I cursed.

21 And it came to pass that the Lord showed unto Enoch all the inhabitants of the earth; and he beheld, and lo, <u>Zion, in process of time, was taken up into heaven. And the Lord said unto Enoch: Behold mine abode forever</u>.

They did "the Lord [call] his people Zion"?

(because they were of one heart and one mind, and dwelt in righteousness; and there was no poor among them)

D. Todd Christofferson

"Zion is Zion because of the character, attributes, and faithfulness of her citizens. Remember, 'the Lord called his people Zion, because they were of one heart and one mind, and dwelt in righteousness; and there was no poor among them.' If we would establish Zion in our homes, branches, wards, and stakes, we must rise to this standard. It will be necessary (1) to become unified in one heart and one mind; (2) to become, individually and collectively, a holy people; and (3) to care for the poor and needy with such effectiveness that we eliminate poverty among us. We cannot wait until Zion comes for these things to happen—Zion will come only as they happen." (CR, Oct. 2008)

Keith B. McMullin

"The ancient prophet Enoch labored many years to bring his people to this state of righteousness. Like our day, they also lived in a time of wickedness, wars, and bloodshed. But the righteous people responded. 'And the Lord called his people Zion, because they were of one heart and one mind, and dwelt in righteousness; and there was no poor among them.'

"Take special note of the word because in this scripture. Zion is established and flourishes because of the God-inspired lives and labors of its citizens. Zion comes not as a gift but because virtuous covenant people are drawn together and build it.... Gathered in the Lord's appointed way, Latter-day Saints conscientiously strive to bring forth Zion as the 'kingdom of our God and his Christ,' preparatory to the Lord's Second Coming." Suppose it spreads from heart to heart, from neighborhood to neighborhood, from city to city, and from nation to nation, how long would it be before the earth would become revolutionized." What did the Lord promise Enoch about the people Zion"?

(in process of time, was taken up into heaven)

Virginia H. Pearce

"The people of the city of Enoch are remembered by us as so good—so incredibly good—that the whole city was taken up into heaven. But if we read carefully we see that the city of Zion was taken up into heaven 'in process of time.' Just like the pioneers, just like you and me, it must have been a process of walking forward, step by step, over a long period of time." (CR, April 1997)

Joseph Smith

"The nearer man approaches perfection, the clearer are his views, and the greater his enjoyments, till he has overcome the evils of his life and lost every desire for sin; and like the ancients, arrives at that point of faith where he is wrapped in the power and glory of his Maker and is caught up to dwell with Him. But we consider that this is a station to which no man ever arrived in a moment." (TPJS, pg. 51)

The Lord Weeps Because of the Wickedness of Man

Note in verse 21 he sees Zion taken up while he is having a vision of all the inhabitants of the earth. Lets read more of what he sees in this vision.

Moses 7:28-31

28 And it came to pass that the God of heaven looked upon the residue of the people, and he wept; and Enoch bore record of it, saying: How is it that the heavens weep, and shed forth their tears as the rain upon the mountains?

29 And Enoch said unto the Lord: How is it that thou canst weep, seeing <u>thou art</u><u>holy</u>, and from all eternity to all eternity?

30 And were it possible that man could number the particles of the earth, yea, millions of earths like this, i<u>t would not be a beginning to the number of thy</u> creations; and thy curtains are stretched out still; and yet thou art there, and thy bosom is there; and also <u>thou art just</u>; thou art merciful and kind forever; 31 And thou hast taken Zion to thine own bosom, from all thy creations, from all eternity to all eternity; and naught but peace, justice, and t<u>ruth is the habitation of thy</u> throne; and mercy shall go before thy face and have no end; how is it thou canst weep?

Why is Enoch so surprised that God is weeping?

(thou art holy, and from all eternity to all eternity it would not be a beginning to the number of thy creations thou art just; thou art merciful and kind forever ruth is the habitation of thy throne)

The Lord answers Enoch question

Moses 7:32-33,36-37

32 The Lord said unto Enoch: Behold these thy brethren; they are the workmanship of mine own hands, and I gave unto them their knowledge, in the day I created them; and in the Garden of Eden, gave I unto man his agency;

33 And unto thy brethren have I said, and also given commandment, that they should love one another, and that they should choose me, their Father; <u>but behold, they are</u> without affection, and they hate their own blood;

36 Wherefore, I can stretch forth mine hands and hold all the creations which I have made; and mine eye can pierce them also, and <u>among all the workmanship of mine</u> hands there has not been so great wickedness as among thy brethren.

37 But behold, their sins shall be upon the heads of their fathers; Satan shall be their father, and misery shall be their doom; and the whole heavens shall weep over them, even all the workmanship of mine hands; wherefore should not the heavens weep, seeing these shall suffer?

Why was the Lord weeping?

His children are choosing wickedness with the agency He has given them

(in the Garden of Eden, gave I unto man his agency but behold, they are without affection, and they hate their own blood among all the workmanship of mine hands there has not been so great wickedness as among thy brethren should not the heavens weep, seeing these shall suffer)

Marion D. Hanks

"God, from whom all blessings come, asked of his children only that they should love each other and choose him, their Father.

"But as in our day, many neither sought the Lord nor had love for each other, and when God foresaw the suffering that would inevitably follow this self-willed, rebellious course of sin, he wept. That, he told Enoch, was what he had to cry about." (CR, April 1980)

Enoch sees the time of Noah and the time when Christ shall redeem the dead Christ pleads to the Father for the sake of those who shall parish in the flood

Moses 7:38-40

38 But behold, <u>these which thine eyes are upon shall perish in the floods</u>; and behold, <u>I will shut them up</u>; a prison have I prepared for them.

39 And that which I have chosen hath pled before my face. Wherefore, he suffereth for their sins; inasmuch as they will repent in the day that my Chosen shall return unto me, and until that day they shall be in torment;

40 Wherefore, for this shall the heavens weep, yea, and all the workmanship of mine hands.

How long will those who repent in the spirt prison be in torment?

(in the day that my Chosen shall return unto me)

Why are they in torment?

There has not yet been an atonement or resurrection

(in the day that my Chosen shall return unto me)

George Q. Cannon

"Those millions of spirits who had thus committed sin and iniquity until it could be borne no longer, until the earth groaned under their wickedness,... were swept away from the face of the earth, and consigned to a place of torment, or to a prison. In this prison they were immured, doubtless in utter darkness—in the condition that is so expressly described by the Savior Himself, when upon the earth—in outer darkness, where there is weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth, a place of torment, where they were kept until the Savior Himself came in the flesh, and proclaimed unto the children of men the Gospel of life and salvation." 1 Peter 3:18-20

18 For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit:

19 By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison; 20 Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were saved by water.

Enoch Perceives the Yearnings of the Earth

Enoch sees that the earth its self is in sorrow because of the wickedness of man

Moses 7:48-50

48 And it came to pass that Enoch looked upon the earth; and he heard a voice from the bowels thereof, saying: Wo, wo is me, the mother of men; I am pained, I am weary, <u>because of the wickedness of my children</u>. When shall I rest, and be cleansed from the filthiness which is gone forth out of me? When will my Creator sanctify me, that I may rest, and righteousness for a season abide upon my face?

49 And when Enoch heard the earth mourn, he wept, and cried unto the Lord, saying: O Lord, wilt thou not have compassion upon the earth? Wilt thou not bless the children of Noah?

50 And it came to pass that Enoch continued his cry unto the Lord, saying: I ask thee, O Lord, in the name of thine Only Begotten, even Jesus Christ, that thou wilt have mercy upon Noah and his seed, that the earth might never more be covered by

the floods.

Why is the earth weary and in pain?

(because of the wickedness of my children)

Spencer W. Kimball

"I have traveled much in various assignments over the years, and when I pass through the lovely countryside or fly over the vast and beautiful expanses of our globe, I compare these beauties with many of the dark and miserable practices of men, and I have the feeling that the good earth can hardly bear our presence upon it....

"The Brethren constantly cry out against that which is intolerable in the sight of the Lord: against pollution of mind, body, and our surroundings; against vulgarity, stealing, lying, pride, and blasphemy; against fornication, adultery, homosexuality, and all other abuses of the sacred power to create; against murder and all that is like unto it; against all manner of desecration." Prepare for the second coming when the earth will be sanctified

"The earth itself has groaned under the load of sin and corruption which has been upon its face.... But the time will come, when it will be sanctified. We are living near that period of time. It is for this purpose you have come to these mountains. It is for this purpose you have received the spirit of truth, the Holy Ghost, the comforter, to sanctify you, and prepare you to take part in this great work of the latter days, which God has decreed from the beginning should come to pass in its time and season." Events Leading to the Second Coming and Millennium

Enoch saw some of the events that lead to the second coming

Moses 7:61-62,66

61 And the day shall come that the earth shall rest, but before that day the <u>heavens</u> shall be darkened, and a veil of darkness shall cover the earth; and the heavens shall shake, and also the earth; and great tribulations shall be among the children of men, but my people will I preserve;

62 And <u>righteousness will I send down out of heaven</u>; and <u>truth will I send forth out</u> of the earth, to bear testimony of mine Only Begotten; his resurrection from the dead; yea, and also the resurrection of all men; and <u>righteousness and truth will I</u>

cause to sweep the earth as with a flood, to gather out mine elect from the four quarters of the earth, unto a place which I shall prepare, an Holy City, that my people may gird up their loins, and be looking forth for the time of my coming; for there shall be my tabernacle, and it shall be called Zion, a New Jerusalem.

66 But before that day he saw great tribulations among the wicked; and he also saw the sea, that it was troubled, and men's hearts failing them, looking forth with fear for the judgments of the Almighty God, which should come upon the wicked.

What does the Lord say about the wickedness that will be prevalent in the last days?

(heavens shall be darkened, and a veil of darkness great tribulations shall be among the children of men men's hearts failing them)

But what does the Lord promise concerning those who seek after Him in the last days?

(but my people will I preserve righteousness will I send down out of heaven truth will I send forth out of the earth, to bear testimony of mine Only Begotten righteousness and truth will I cause to sweep the earth as with a flood gather out mine elect from the four quarters of the earth my people may gird up their loins, and be looking forth for the time of my coming)

L. Aldin Porter

"The Lord, of course, saw our day. He saw the devastating effects of transgression. And He prophesied that He would provide protection for His people. He spoke to Enoch of the last days—the days of wickedness and vengeance—and He said,... 'Truth will I send forth out of the earth'? To do what? 'To bear testimony of mine Only Begotten.'

Moses 7:63,64-65

63 And the Lord said unto Enoch: Then shalt thou and all thy city meet them there, and we will receive them into our bosom, and they shall see us; and we will fall upon their necks, and they shall fall upon our necks, and we will kiss each other;

64 And there shall be mine abode, and it shall be Zion, which shall come forth out of all the creations which I have made; and for the space of a thousand years the earth shall rest.

65 And it came to pass that Enoch saw the day of the coming of the Son of Man, in the last days, to dwell on the earth in righteousness for the space of a thousand years;

John Taylor

"Enoch was caught up to heaven and his Zion with him. And we are told in latter revelation in relation to these matters that a Zion will be built up in our day; that great trouble will overtake the inhabitants of the earth; and that when the time arrives, the Zion that was caught up will descend, and the Zion that will be organized here will ascend, both possessed of the same spirit, their peoples having been preserved by the power of God according to His purposes and as His children, to take part in the events of the latter days. We are told that when the people of these two Zions meet, they will fall on each others' necks, and embrace and kiss each other." (JD, 25:303)

After 365 years of righteousness, where God Himself dwelt with them, God received Zion unto Himself

Moses 7:67-69

67 And the Lord showed Enoch all things, even unto the end of the world; and he saw the day of the righteous, the hour of their redemption, and received a fulness of joy;

68 And all the days of Zion, in the days of Enoch, were three hundred and sixty-five years.

69 And Enoch and all his people walked with God, and he dwelt in the midst of Zion; and it came to pass that Zion was not, for God received it up into his own bosom; and from thence went forth the saying, ZION IS FLED.
